

5. Sew H rectangles to opposite sides of the dark flower units; sew I rectangles to the top and bottom (Figure 5a). Repeat with light flower unit, J rectangles and K rectangles (Figure 5b).

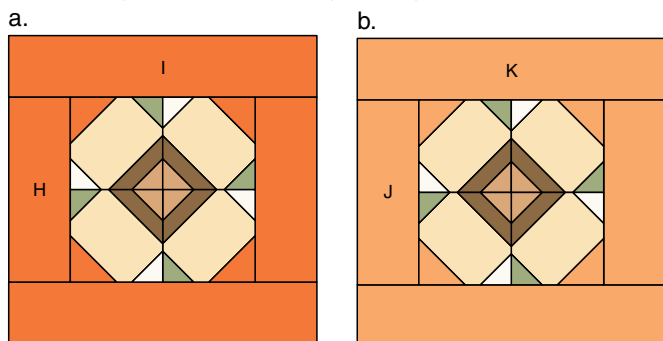

6. Refer to Sew & Flip Corners and the Dark and Light Pumpkin block diagrams and sew L squares to the corners of the step 5 units to make two Dark Pumpkin blocks and one Light Pumpkin block.

Completing the Wall Hanging

1. Refer to the Assembly Diagram and sew together the blocks and M strips alternately in a vertical row; sew the N strips to opposite long sides of the wall hanging center.

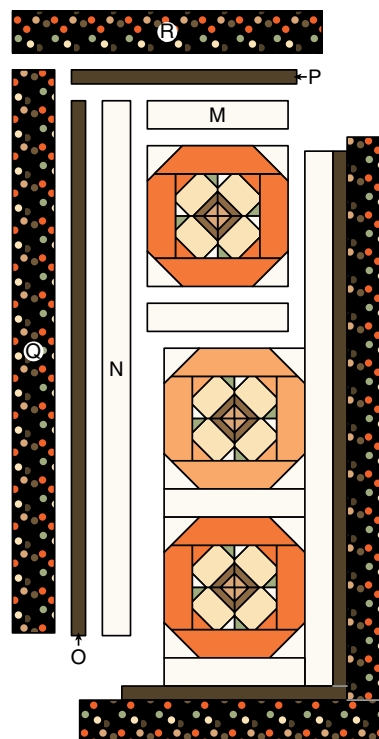
2. Sew the borders to the wall hanging center in alphabetical order to complete the wall hanging top.

3. Layer, baste, quilt wall hanging as desired and bind referring to Quilting Basics. The photographed wall hanging was stitched in the ditch and straight line echo quilted.

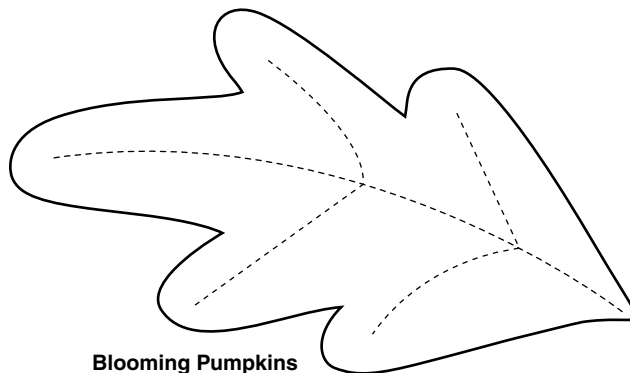
4. Prepare templates for the stem, large leaf and small leaf using the patterns provided. Refer to Raw-Edge Fusible Appliqué on page 26 and prepare the appliqué shapes as follows:

- Green print – 3 large leaves, 3 small leaves
- Dark brown print – 3 stems

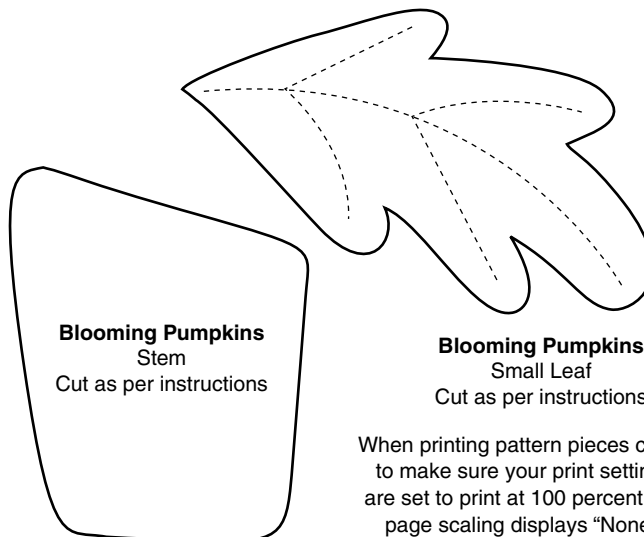
5. Refer to the photo and place one of each large leaf, small leaf and stem on each pumpkin. When satisfied, fuse in place referring to manufacturer's instructions. Straight-stitch along edge of stem and add veins to leaves using matching threads to complete the wall hanging. ●

5. Sew together one each of the F-G, F-H and F-G reversed units to make row 2 for a Face block (Figure 5). Make four of row 2.

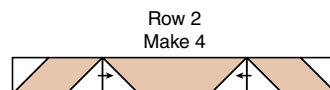

6. Join two I pieces, two J pieces and one K piece to make row 3 for a Face block (Figure 6). Make four of row 3.

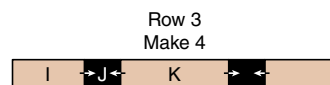

7. Again using the sew-and-flip technique, make four each of the L-M and L-M reversed units (Figure 7).

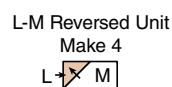

8. Join two M pieces, two N pieces and one O piece with one each of the L-M and L-M reversed units to make row 4 for a Face block (Figure 8). Make four of row 4.

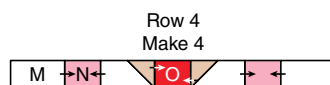

When printing pattern pieces check to make sure your print settings are set to print at 100 percent and page scaling displays "None."

9. Again using the sew-and-flip technique, make four each of the P-Q and P-Q reversed units (Figure 9).

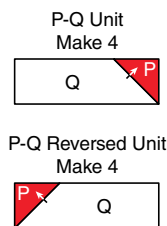

10. Join one each of the P-Q and P-Q reversed units to an R rectangle to make row 6 for a Face block (Figure 10). Make four of row 6.

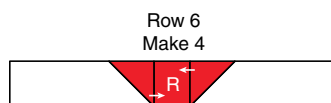

11. Again using the sew-and-flip technique, make four of row 7 for a Face block (Figure 11).

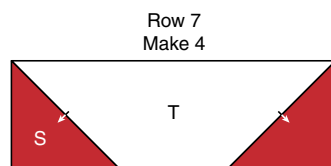

12. Join one each of rows 1–7 to complete a Face block (Figure 12). Make four Face blocks.

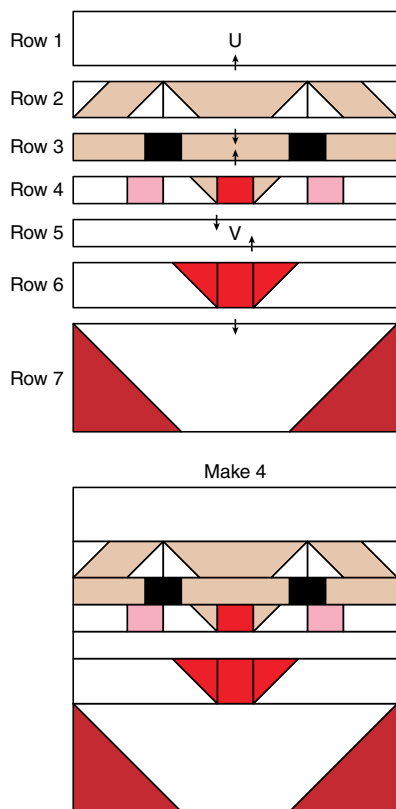

13. Refer to Half-Square Triangles on page 16 and use the W and X squares to make four HST units (Figure 13). Trim each HST unit to 9½" square, centering the diagonal seams.

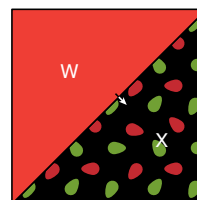
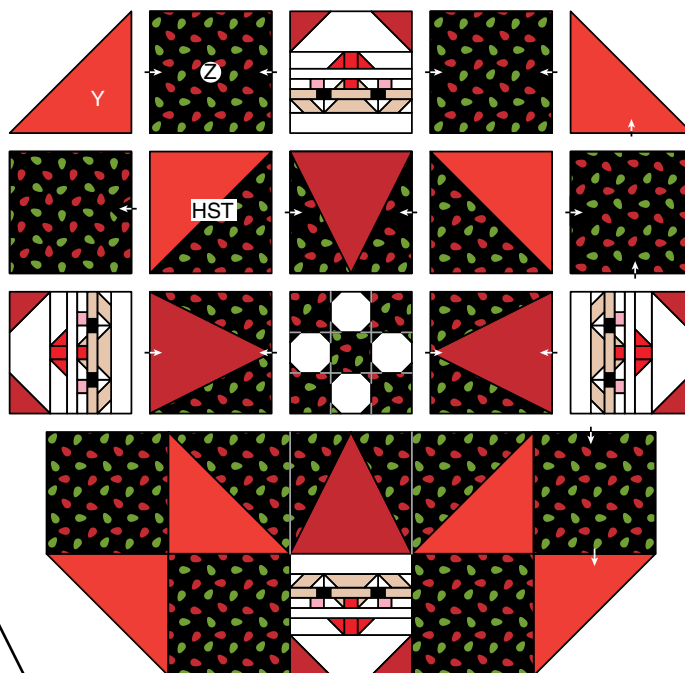

Completing the Quilt

1. Referring to the Assembly Diagram, lay out the blocks, HST units, Y triangles and Z squares in five rows of five each, noting the placement and rotation.
2. Sew the rows and then join the rows to complete the quilt top. Press.
3. Layer, baste, quilt as desired and bind referring to Quilting Basics. The photographed quilt was quilted with diagonal, vertical and horizontal straight lines, avoiding the Face blocks. ●

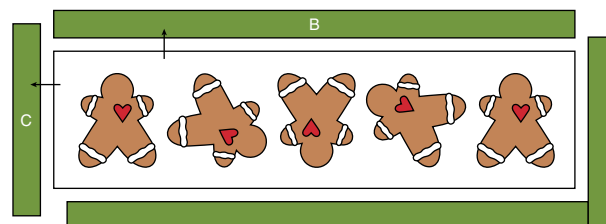
3. Referring to the photo, place a leg trim across each leg and an arm trim across each arm. Fuse in place. Place a heart on each gingerbread boy; fuse in place. Machine blanket-stitch around the appliqués using matching thread to complete the appliqué panel.

2. Referring to Quilting Basics, layer, baste and quilt as desired. The photographed runner was quilted with a candy cane design. Transfer the smile pattern to each face and quilt two times on the lines using black thread. Sew two buttons to each face for eyes.

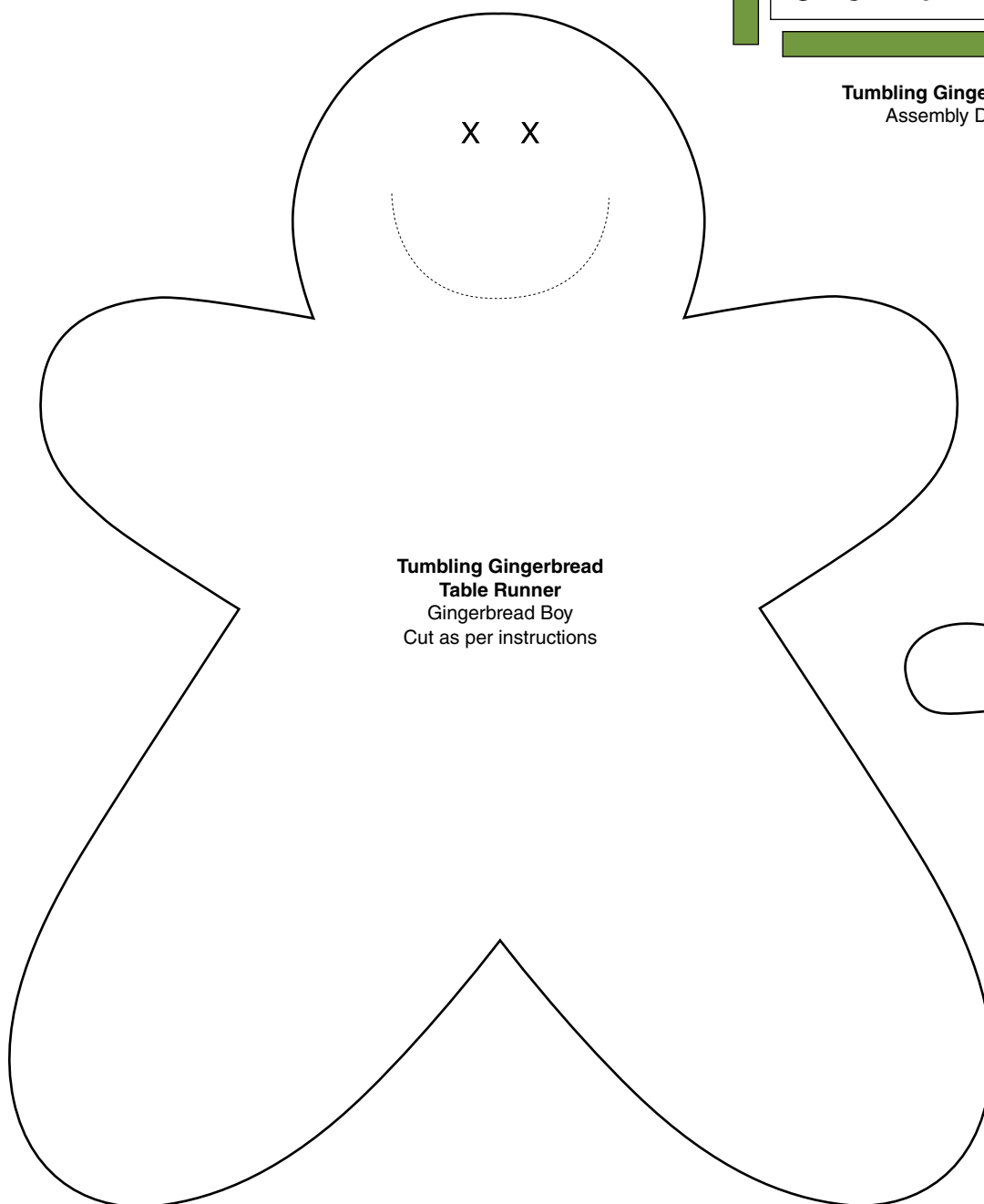
3. Bind referring to Quilting Basics. ●

Completing the Runner

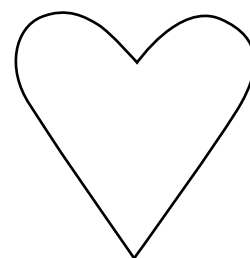
1. Referring to the Assembly Diagram, sew B strips to the long sides of the panel. Sew C strips to the short sides.



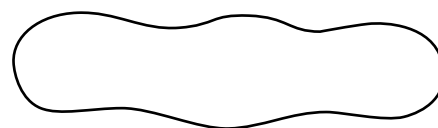
Tumbling Gingerbread Table Runner
